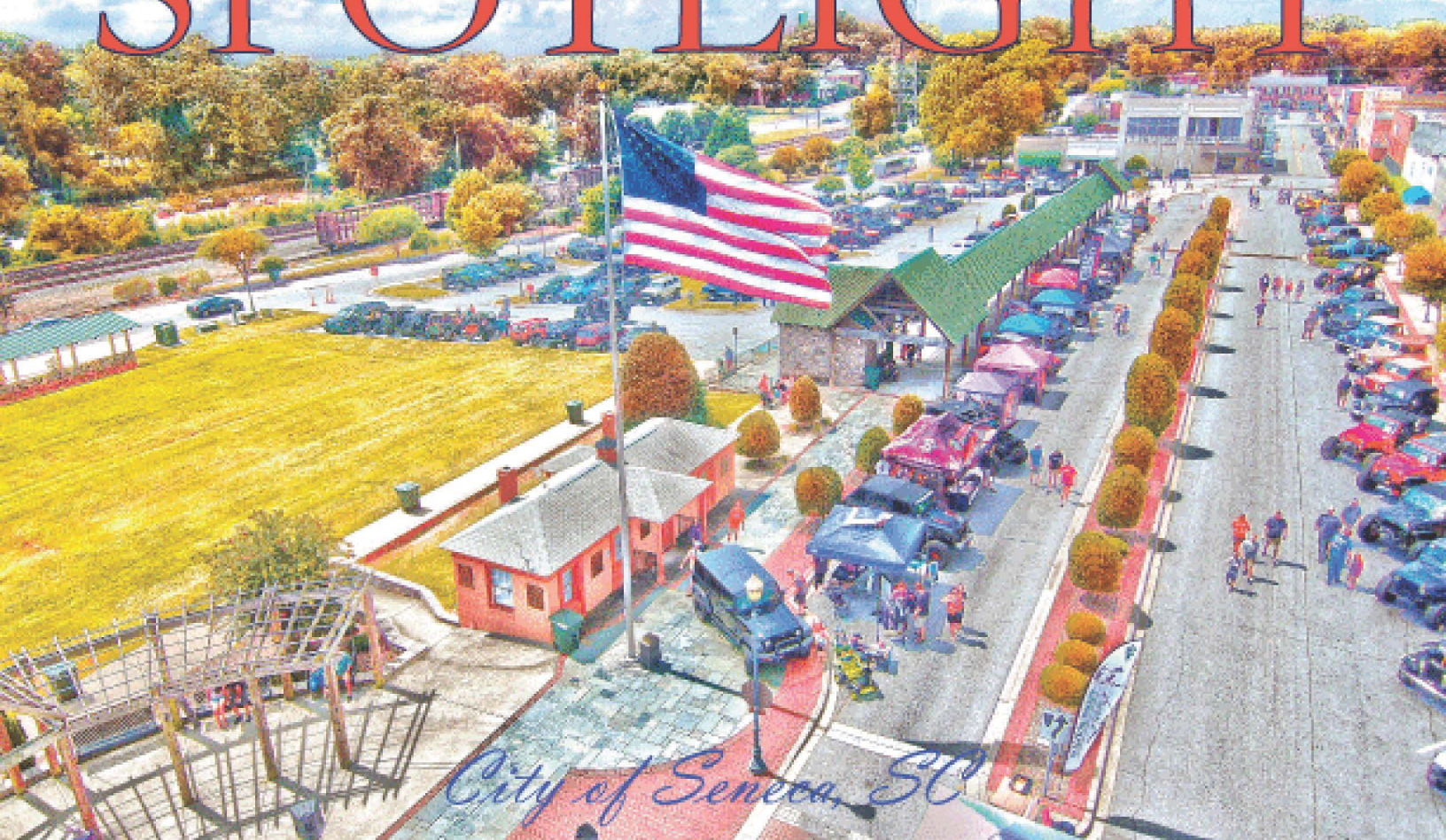

From our families to yours, we wish you and yours a safe and happy Thanksgiving.

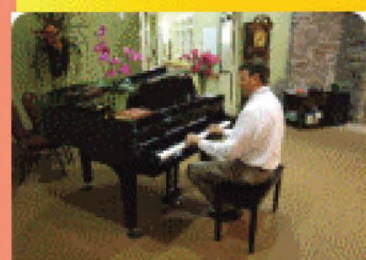
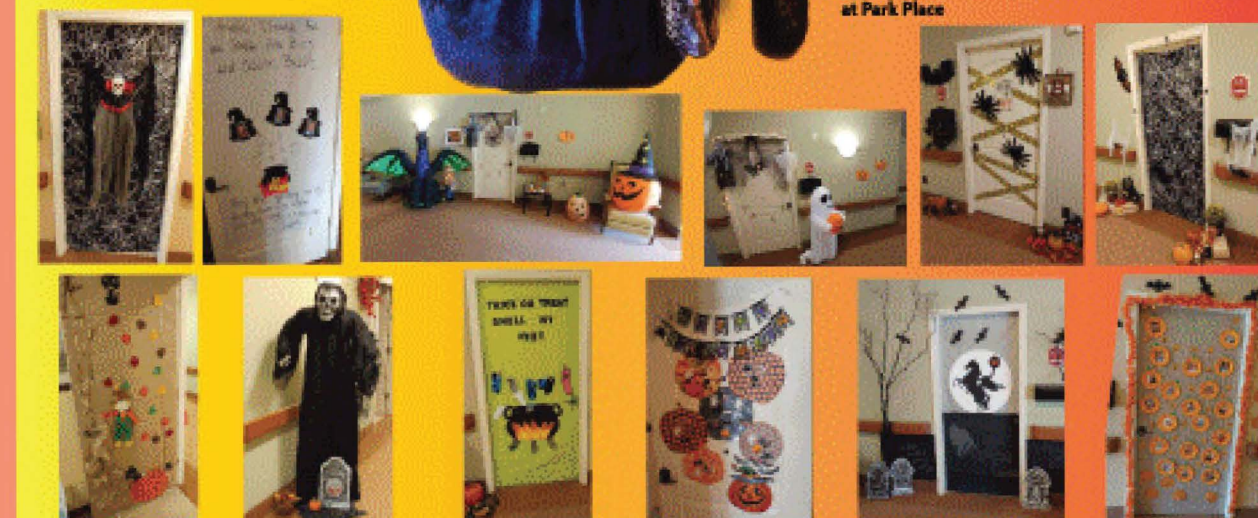

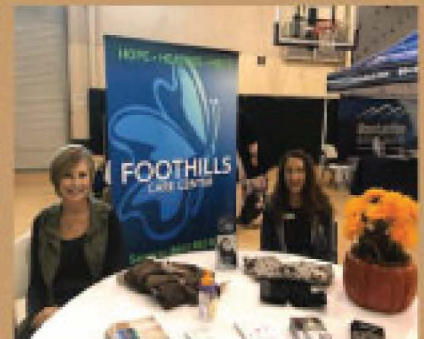
New banner design for Martin Luther King Way
