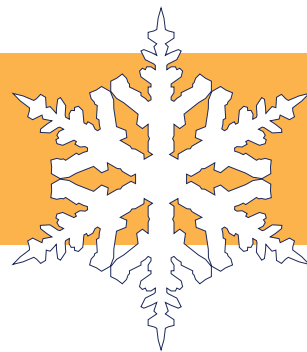

Stop by Bertha Lee Strickland Cultural Museum and enjoy hot beverages, Christmas music and more on the patio.

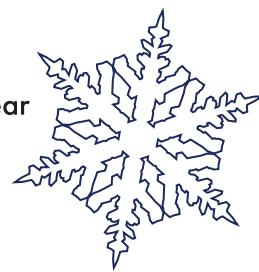

The Magical Musical Holiday Light Show

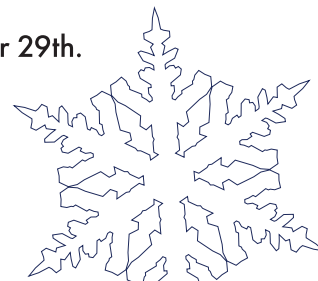
Start a new family tradition this year by visiting downtown Seneca to experience the City's new Christmas light show set to music.

A kind act by two anonymous donors will help prevent a struggling Seneca family from having a blue Christmas this year by keeping their utilities on.


The billing supervisor in the Seneca Light & Water customer service office recounted that she and her staff were astounded when two individuals walked in and offered to take care of the bill of a family having difficulty paying their utility bills. A family that had been having financial difficulty, but still diligently paying regular amounts on their bill, was quickly identified, and the donors happily agreed to take care of the balance of the account.

The staff of the customer service department were all fighting back tears.

"They did not know this family at all," one of the customer service representatives marveled. "They just told us they had been blessed and wanted to share."
